- 7:00 a.m. 8:30 a.m. Check-in for Foods Category prior to judging and qualifying items of Arts & Crafts and Shop Art (1st – 6th place items)
- 8:30 a.m. 10:00 a.m. Judging of Foods Category with Top 6 advancing to Silent Auction
- Conclusion of Foods Judging 4:30 p.m. Silent Auction Open
- 4:30 p.m. Silent Auction Closed
- 5:00 p.m. 5:45 p.m. Buyers must pay for and pick up items won in auction
- 5:45 p.m. 6:15 p.m. Calls made to 2nd name on bid sheets for pick up and payment
- 6:30 p.m. Remaining Silent Auction items must be picked up by exhibitor

AGE GROUPS

Clover Kids: $K - 2^{nd}$ (Non-competitive basis – participation ribbon only)

Junior: 3rd – 5th grade

Intermediate: 6th - 8th grade

Senior: $9^{th} - 12^{th}$ grade

GENERAL RULES

- Entry fees are \$6.00 per item
- Entry forms and fees are due in the Extension Office on Friday, December 4th by 5:00 p.m.
 - All photography entries must be submitted digitally by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, December 4th
 - Late entries (except photography) will be accepted until Friday, December 11th with a late fee of \$30.00 per entry
- Entry fees must be paid at the County Extension Office via cash or check (payable to Erath 4-H)
- Only one entry per class per exhibitor allowed
- All entries must be the original work of the exhibitor
- All entries must have been made within the past year by the 4-H member
- Entries cannot have been entered in a previous Erath 4-H Youth Fair, regardless of placing
- Entries must adhere to size requirements specified in each category
- During judging, names will not be displayed
 - o Each entry will be given a number
 - Names will be displayed after judging
- ITEM INFO CARD must accompany ALL items at check-in
 - o Cards must be completed prior to check-in
 - Cards may be typed or hand-written
- This is a 4-H Youth Fair, open to currently enrolled Erath County 4-H members only
 - There will be a standard academic eligibility check as in any 4-H competitive event
- All Youth Fair exhibitors are encouraged to do at least one of the following:
 - o Sell raffle tickets on Friday, January 8th
 - Help before, during, and after Silent Auction on Friday, January 8th
 - Help clean up facility on January 14th @ 3:00 p.m.
- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to read the 2021 Rules & Guidelines
- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure entry is properly checked-in
 - Exhibitor DOES NOT have to be present to check-in item

PRIZES

- Monetary prizes will be awarded to 1st 3rd place in each category
- Ribbons will be awarded to the top 6 places
- Best of Show will be awarded in each Division (Arts & Crafts, Foods, Shop Art, and Photography). Best of Show winners will receive an additional award based on overall best appearance and most unique presentation. Best of Show winners

will also be recognized before the JLSEC Sale on Saturday evening (exhibitor may bring item to the sale, but is not required).

- Monetary prize amounts will be dependent on number of entries and sponsors
- Youth prize money will NOT be available the day of the event. Money will be available for pick-up at the Extension Office once sponsorship and silent auction funds have been processed. Exhibitors will be notified via email.

SILENT AUCTION

- ONLY 1st 6th place items qualify to participate in the Silent Auction
- Silent Auction will be held on Friday, January 8th from the conclusion of Foods Judging – 4:30 p.m.
- Buyers must pay for and pick up items between 5:00 p.m. 5:45 p.m. on Friday
 - At 5:45 p.m., second bid names will be called to pay and pick up item by 6:15 p.m.
- Proceeds from Silent Auction will go to the youth who entered the item
- Youth must write a thank you note to their buyer and bring it, a copy, or email a
 picture to the Extension Office prior to receiving their proceeds from the auction
- Any silent auction money left at the office three weeks after funds are available will revert back to the 4-H Youth Fair account
- Clovers may participate in Silent Auction

ARTS & CRAFTS

- All Arts & Crafts will be judged on Tuesday, January 5th, 2021
- Items must be checked-in between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, Jan. 7th
- All items must be picked up between 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday following judging
- ONLY 1st 6th place items qualify to participate in the Silent Auction
- 1st 6th place items must be checked in on Friday between 7:00 a.m. 8:30 a.m. for Public Viewing and (optional) Silent Auction
- All Silent Auction items that did not sell must be picked up on Friday at 6:30 p.m.
- Items created from a "kit" are allowed, but HIGHLY DISCOURAGED and will be judged accordingly

CLASSES

- **Drawings** all hand created with drawing tool (pencil, charcoal, etc.). Work created with pencil or charcoal will need to be sprayed with fixative to avoid smearing. All artwork needs to be matted or on stretched canvas. Size limitations: no work larger than 18 inches x 24 inches including the mat.
- **Paintings** all hand created with paint brush and medium (acrylic, watercolor, etc.). All artwork needs to be matte or on stretched canvas. Size limitations: no work larger than 18 inches x 24 inches including the mat.
- Fashion Storyboard storyboards contain an original design illustration, design flats, and additional materials such as design inspirations, fabric swatches, trims, and other design details. Storyboards should be no larger than 20 inches x 30 inches and should be displayed on foam or mat board. Do not use poster board. Please follow the Texas 4-H Storyboard Guidelines.
- **Textiles** includes any item made from cloth, fiber, leather, etc. Please state on your entry card if you created your item from a pattern or it this was a freeform creation.
- Open for any arts & crafts item that are created but do not fit in the above subcategories. This could include, but is not limited to, repurposed/recycled projects, floral arrangements, 3-D art, candles, paper crafts, or items made from household materials like Legos, popsicle sticks, straws, clay, mason jars, soap, etc.
 - o **Open Small** items must fit into a 24 in x 24 in x 24 in cube.
 - o Open Large no size limit

FOODS

- All Foods will be judged on Friday, January 8th, 2021
- Items must be checked-in between 7:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. on Friday, Jan. 8th
- ONLY 1st 6th place items qualify to participate in the Silent Auction
- Top 6 placings from each age group will be placed in the Silent Auction unless otherwise instructed
- All food items must be made from scratch
 - No mixes allowed!
- All food items must include the recipe used to make the item
- All food entries must include a judge's sample on a separate plate and covered with plastic wrap
 - Judge's sample may come from entry, but it is encouraged to keep entry whole if placing item in Silent Auction
- For food safety reasons, food items that require temperature control (including cream and custard pies) and do not comply with the Texas Department of State Health Services Cottage Food Production Operations law will NOT be allowed

 - Recipes may be submitted to the office prior to the week of Youth Fair for approval to avoid disqualification
- All Silent Auction items that did not sell must be picked up on Friday at 6:30 p.m.

CLASSES

- **Desserts** brownies, drop cookies, bar cookies, cakes, etc.
- **Candy** brittle, praline, hard candy, fudge, sugar work, etc.
- Decorated Desserts fondant cakes, gingerbread houses, royal icing, cupcakes, etc.
- **Breads** quick or yeast, savory or sweet
- **Pies** fruit, savory, etc.
- Snacks crackers, trail mix, granola, flavored popcorn, etc.

PHOTOGRAPHY

- All photography entries must be submitted digitally by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, December 4th. They will be judged prior to Youth Fair.
- To submit photography entries, email them (one photo per email) to erath@ag.tamu.edu. Entries that are not received correctly will be disqualified.
 - o Be sure to include in the email subject line:
 - Name of Youth
 - Age Group

- Photography Category
- Designation (District or Youth Fair-see note in red below; Youth Fair entries automatically progress to District Contest if qualified, District only entries must be designated as such. See link below for District entry information).
- Included in the entry fee is the matting fee
- 1st 6th place winners will be notified via email
- 1st 6th place winners must bring their photos (printed at 8" x 10" size) to the Extension Office no later than Tuesday, January 5th
- 1st 6th place winners' photos will be matted and on display for Public Viewing and (optional) Silent Auction on Friday, January 8th
- All Silent Auction items that did not sell must be picked up on Friday at 6:30 p.m.
- All Junior, Intermediate, and Senior entries will automatically be entered in the Erath County 4-H Photography Contest to qualify for the District 8 Photography Contest at no additional charge.

CLASSES

- Animals photos with animal emphasis
- Details & Macro extremely close-up photos; small details that suggest a larger story
- Nature & Landscapes landscapes, outdoor scenic, nature images, sunsets, urban landscapes, seascapes, cityscapes, and farms. Images focus on the beauty of the outdoors
- **People** focus of photo is one or more persons
- Catch-All photos that don't fit into any other category, such as night photography, marine, food, elements of design, dominant color, plant/flora, etc.
- Theme: Forced Perspective new theme provided by Texas 4-H each year. See link below for more information:

SHOP ART

- All Arts & Crafts will be judged on Tuesday, January 5th, 2021
- Items must be checked-in between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, Jan. 5th
- All items must be picked up between 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday following judging
- ONLY 1st 6th place items qualify to participate in the Silent Auction

- 1st 6th place items must be checked in on Friday between 7:00 a.m. 8:30 a.m. for Public Viewing and (optional) Silent Auction
- All Silent Auction items that did not sell must be picked up on Friday at 6:30 p.m.
- Items created from a "kit" are allowed, but HIGHLY DISCOURAGED and will be judged accordingly

CLASSES

- Woodworking items made from wood (bookends, shelves, birdhouses, wood carving, etc.)
- Plasma Metal Art items made from metal using a plasma cutter/welder. Two types of Plasma Metal Art will be judged:
 - Computer Cut
 - Hand Cut
- Traditional Metal Art items made from metal using a mig or stick/arc welder
- Open items made using other materials (pvc pipe, wire, rubber, etc.) or a combination of materials
 - o **Open Small** items must fit into a 48 in x 48 in x 48 in cube
 - Open Large no size limit

SHOWMANSHIP

- Showmanship will be judged on Tuesday, January 5th, 2021
- Youth will be assigned a time slot between 12:00 p.m. 4:00 p.m.
- Youth may enter showmanship for their respective age division ONCE, regardless of how many total entries are submitted
- Youth may pick one item to submit in showmanship contest from any Youth Fair category
 - o Item must be already entered in Youth Fair
 - For food items, a separate item must be made and presented for showmanship and the foods contest on Friday
- Youth must provide a binder with details of their project, and steps they took to complete it. If they have questions on this, they may contact the County Extension Office for assistance.
 - This may include but is not limited to pictures, design plans, textile patterns, supply expenses, time spent, help received, etc.
- Exhibitor and Item will be judged for Showmanship by a separate group of judges from the category judging

- o Exhibitor appearance, knowledge, presentation and self-demeanor
- o Item finish and quality, degree of difficulty, documentation
- One winner from each age division (Clover, Junior, Intermediate, and Senior) will be selected and presented an award
